## JUBILEE TREE PLANTING

The Jubilee trees for Purley (see October issue) are going ahead. Exciting things began to happen almost as soon as we started looking for sites, the Parish Council established a tree planting sub-Committee which did endless careful work with the Newbury District Council and the Berkshire County Council. People gave trees - six from one source to the Parish Council, one from another, and four to be planted in the Lock Meadow.

These last presented a serious challenge as fencing against cows had to be provided - you may have seen the S.O.S. for help, and by the time this goes to press there should be twenty impeccable 7 ft ex-railway sleeper anti-cow posts in position - all put up by generous voluntary labour and generous expert help.

Even with the expense of the fencing there was still enough money in the Exhibition fund for three more trees, so there will be 15 in all - lime, oak, walnut, hornbeam, Norway maple, copper beeches, holm oaks, horse chestnuts, a wild white cherry and a new Cedar of Lebanon for Lister Close to replace the Coronation Cedar which got its top blown out in gales of January a year ago. Quite a story to the Cedar if the Editor has room! Cedars were disappointingly not available from any commercial source, then someone appeared saying, "I hear you want a new Cedar for Lister Close, and cannot get one. I've got one grown by my father-in-law which you can have - when will you come to collect it?"

So - 15 new trees on order, lots achieved, and lots still to do - but so far, very good.
